




# YEAR 6 ELECTIONS

of food for the St Vincent de Paul Society and The Mercy Hospice Centre. This means we have helped over 2000 families with canned food over the Christmas period.


## Please deliver cans to classrooms during the week where they will be stored until collection on Friday.
