

SCHOOL ATHLETICS DAY - Wednesday, 18th November

Our School Athletics Sports take place next Wednesday at the AUT Millennium Stadium. The children will walk to the Stadium via Rangitoto College with their teachers. A Police Officer has been requested to oversee the road crossing at the lights. Children need to bring a good lunch and plenty to drink for the day.

We will be starting our programme at 9:20am with the 800m event for Year 4-6 runners. All 800m runners are to be at the track by 9am as the event will be run before the rest of the school arrives. *Parents: if your child is in this event, please taken them directly to the stadium where they are to report to Mrs Dorrington.* From 9:50am onwards the children will be involved in a variety of activities on and around the track. For ease of organisation the children will be grouped in their year levels. Each child will have a card pinned to their T-shirt which will record their achievements throughout the day. The programme is detailed below. Please note the times are approximate and could be subject to change.
