Principal for A Day



LIFE EDUCATION TRUST

This week the Life Education caravan is onsite at St John's. Many of you may remember Harold the giraffe from your own childhood. SCHOOL SWIMMING POOL AND KEYS FOR SUMMER USE

The pool is now open for swimming for the Summer **unless indicated otherwise by signage at the pool**. You are offered a family key to take advantage of the pool for family swimming.
