Our Swimming Sports is always a special event and the children are keen to get in the pool and compete for their house teams. The format we adopted last year worked well so we will be continuing the same way this year. This means that the Waitemata Team (Year 4 to 6) children will be participating in the morning, starting at 9.30am, and competing for the **Nicola Jack Memorial Cup**. The Nicola Jack Memorial Cup was presented by her family to the school for our swimming sports in memory of Nicola Jack who was in Year 3 but tragically died as a result of an accident in 1991. The cup is presented to the winning house team.

Rangitoto Yeam (Year 1 to 3) children will be participating in the afternoon, starting at 1.15pm, where they will have the opportunity to showcase what they have been learning and enjoy time together in the pool area.

We ask you to refrain from going into the pool area, rather, enjoy sitting on the surrounding banks. For safety reasons the children will not be allowed to leave the pool enclosure. They will have their hats on while not swimming and should also bring a T-shirt in their house colour to wear at the pool. Please feel free to give your child 'named' sunscreen to put on or apply it to your child before they come to school.

Please ensure that your children arrive at school with swimming togs, goggles, 2 towels and a water bottle. All items should be clearly named.




## ROSMINI COLLEGE ENROLMENTS FOR 2022

Working alongside a published author, you will be taken on a guided journey at the end of which is a story you have created entirely from scratch.

It's the first step on your own road to becoming a published author.

The course book covers each day's material, along with worksheets and exercises to help you reach the next level in your writing.


# ENVIRONMENTAL INITIATIVES AT ST JOHN'S

## TERRACYCLE – WRITING INSTRUMENTS RECYCLING PROGRAMME

Two years ago, one of our Year 6 students introduced St John's to the Terracycle pen recycling programme. We are continuing to collect items in Room 6 and encourage you to send your empty and/or broken items to Room 6 at any time. Once we have collected approximately 2kg a box will be sent off to be recycled. Each parcel that weighs more than 2kg qualifies for rewards in the form of TerraCycle points. For each kilogram of accepted waste we send through this programme, you'll earn \$1 in donation points, redeemable for a payment to a school or charity of your choice.

## BREAD TAGS FOR WHEELCHAIRS

**YES**, we are still collecting **Bread Tags** at the school office! Bread tags come in many shapes, sizes and colours and are made of High Impact Polystyrene. During the recycling process bread tags usually end up in land fill as they are so small they are 'filtered out'. However, gathered together they can make a difference.



All the ones collected so far by our community have been colour sorted and dropped off to the central Auckland collection point. Between us we gathered approx. 6kgs! However, it takes 200kg of tags to buy one wheelchair so lets keep collecting!
