2021 is a special year for St. John's School and a great opportunity where both past and present can join together and celebrate 60 wonderful years. St John's School was opened and blessed by Archbishop Liston on 1st February 1961. From those early beginnings with a roll of 124 children and five classrooms, to today, where we have a roll of 337 children and 13 classrooms, a rich history and strong community has developed and flourished.

To honour our 60 years, and celebrate St. John the Baptist Feast Day, we invite you to our whole School Mass at 9.15am in St John's Church. We will be having morning tea in the hall for our visiting adults following Mass. Following morning tea guests are most welcome to visit classrooms to view the school in action. Celebrations will conclude with a sausage sizzle for the children at lunchtime.
