Bishop Michael Gielen presided at the Mass, concelebrated with a number of parish priests including our Father Emile. Bishop Michael spoke on a scripture from the Gospel, Matthew 13:44-46:



The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and bought that field.

Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. When he found one of great value, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it.

The Gospel tells us of men who do not think twice; immediately recognising the treasure they have discovered, they rush to sell everything they have to purchase it. Bishop Michael challenged us to think about what we treasure in life. He shared the example set for us by Pope Francis, who consistently and repeatedly shows that he treasures people, particularly the sick, the poor, and the lonely.

On Thursday I hosted all the North Shore Catholic School Principal's at St John's and I was so proud to take them around some of our classrooms to show our teachers and students in action and to walk around our beautiful grounds.

This week Miss Binns and I are attending the New Zealand Principals' Federation Conference in Rotorua. The focus for this is **Power, Passion, Pace; Pai tu Pai hinga! Whakamaua kia tina!** We look forward to bringing back some new thoughts and ideas to share with the leadership and the staff.
