Kia Ora whānau.

George was the first child I welcomed back onsite at the front entrance of school last week. He came zooming up to the gate on his bike with a huge smile on his face. "It's great to see you, George," I said. "It's great to see you too" he replied, and that was all it took to make sense of this very unusual situation we currently find ourselves in. The rest of the morning was filled with our beautiful children, most adorned in masks, waving goodbye to their parents and bouncing into school, bursting to share their stories.

However, it has not been easy. For you, our parent community, this is extremely challenging, your own work commitments accompanied by staggered days of school, and home learning on Fridays. I thank you for your understanding and ongoing support of our team as we endeavour to navigate our way through this.

I also extend my gratitude to my team, who have accepted, adapted, and embraced the current situation. Their commitment to ensuring that the children have fond memories of the last few weeks of school for 2021 is to be commended.

It looks as though we will move to the new Traffic Light System in the not-too-distant future and I will keep you informed of what this will mean for our school as I am expecting more information about this later in the week.

A particular thank you to Mrs Hanabadi for donating mini hand sanitizers for every child in our school.

BUBBLE SCHOOL AND STAGGERED ON-SITE DAYS

As you are aware we are operating our school on staggered days. We made this decision based on advice and guidance from the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Education. Other schools have opted to open differently, allowing all children on-site. Some of these schools justify this decision because their rolls are not full and they have spare learning spaces, they have more than one toilet block and have multi learning spaces (hubs) where children can be spaced out.

We have single cell classrooms, one toilet block and a geographically challenging play area. We have taken absolutely every precaution we can to minimise risk. We have supervised rolling playtimes (8) ongoing throughout the day with each class having allocated play areas. We want all our community to feel safe to be at school.

We understand that people are all at different levels of concern. We are catering for those who are most concerned so that they can return their children to school, albeit in a part time capacity.

I know some families would love for their children to be at school for more days and some have requested this. Although we too would love for this to happen, we are unable to cater for these numbers under the current public health guidelines. We are unable to extend days to any more children as we will be exceeding our safe limit of children on-site. I apologise for any inconvenience this may cause and feel sorry that I cannot help more.

STAFF UPDATE

We are very sorry to be saying farewell to two of our awesome teachers at the end of this year.

Mrs Suzanne Zaisluik, who has been at our school for 13 years, is having a lifestyle change and heading a little further north to take up another teaching role. Mrs Zaisluik has taught mostly in the Senior School, has been Acting Director of Religious Studies and a member of the Senior Leadership Team. We will really miss Suzanne and little Olivia and wish them all the best in their new venture.

Mrs Paula Ritsma is also moving on. Paula has been with us for two and half years. During this time Paula has co-led our Garden to Table programme and our Te Reo/Tikanga Programme. We will all miss Paula very much and wish her well as she continues her teaching career at her new school.

We are very excited to welcome **Mrs Imelda Moss** permanently to our team. Imelda has taught part time this year across the school, and we have absolutely loved having her, so we are thrilled that she will now be with us full time in 2022. **Mrs Grace Atmadji** has opened our new entrants class for the past two years. Grace is a wonderful Junior School teacher and the little ones love her. We are so happy that Grace has agreed to work full time and teach a Year One class for 2022.

REPORTING AND PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCES

As a result of the lockdown and the disruption to onsite learning, experts have stressed the importance of prioritising well-being for all and in particular for children. Our professional opinion, which is shared by most educators, is that testing children immediately upon returning onsite, (which is what would have been required to gather assessment data), is not in the children's best interest. Therefore, onsite learning has focused on ensuring the children are happy, safe and exposed to authentic learning opportunities, with many activities being outdoors.

Therefore, your child's end of year report will look different for 2021. The report will include teacher judgement around the Key Competencies and a written statement covering key observations of learning across curriculum areas and identifying the children's 'bright spots'.

We believe that communication with whānau is extremely important and probably of the most value for our children going into 2022. Therefore, parents will also be offered the opportunity to meet with the teacher via Zoom to discuss their child's learning and well-being.



Recommended Books


