HATS

SUMMER READING

It's important to keep up reading during the summer break, we want our tamariki reading and enjoying reading. Reading needs to be like chocolate, not medicine! You might like to encourage them to read by providing opportunities to get new reading material from your local library, second hand stores, swapping with friends, or the local bookshop.

You could set a reading challenge or encourage reading by stealth - reading board games, recipes, or the subtitles on the TV. They might read to younger brothers or sisters or snuggle up as an older person reads to them, I don't think anybody is too old to enjoy being read to. Audio books are great to listen to on a long car journey, either shared or individually.

If you haven't discovered Libby yet, the summer holidays are the perfect time to browse through all the Ebooks and Audio books the Auckland libraries have to offer through this App. You just need a library membership number, and you are away.

LIBBY APP INSTRUCTIONS

The Libby app is an app that allows you to download audio and E-books from Auckland libraries. They remain available to read on your device for 21 days. All you need is a library card. If you do not have a library card you can get an e- membership <u>here</u> for Auckland libraries. Take note of your library card number.

You can then access Libby on a computer <u>here</u> or by using an app on a phone or lpad etc. for <u>Android/google</u> or here for <u>Apple</u> products



Back to school stationery - order now!

We encourage you to order early to ensure your child has all their stationery requirements ready to go in plenty of time for the start of Term 1. Don't wait until mid-January, order now and avoid the back to school rush.

Laybuy (*Terms & Conditions apply, see myschool.co.nz for details.*) is also available, so you can pay in 6 weekly, interest-free payments - and still get your order right away. Or you can pay by internet banking, credit card or debit card.

When you shop on <u>myschool.co.nz</u> you'll receive free delivery on orders over \$46*. You will also help our school earn school rewards that we use to purchase much needed extra resources for our school.


