Uniform

We are very proud of our uniform and the children wear it with pride. We often receive comments about how well presented our St John's children are. At a recent Board meeting, the Board made the decision to add an additional item to our school uniform, navy culottes.

They will have our school's name embroidered on the leg, the same as the uniform shorts. They can be worn all year round with either the short or long sleeve polo tucked in as per the shorts.

The culottes are currently in production and NZ Uniforms have indicated that they should be available by the end of this year (hopefully earlier). They will cost \$55.00.

Dear Parents

Today our 2022 School Board Election features in our newsletter and you are asked to consider nominations to the School Board that will govern St. John's for the next three years. You may consider standing for election to one of the five parent representative positions or you might know someone you would like to nominate.

Our school Board has eleven members serving on it. Five are elected Parent members, four are appointed by the Bishop of Auckland as Proprietors Appointees, one is a Staff Representative and one, the Principal.

St John's is a great school, and we need a great Board to continue to nurture and develop it further. It is an important governance role, supporting strong professional leadership and effective teaching, and maintaining and developing a high performing school in the best interests of the children. Please give our Board elections your interest and consideration.

The Board has appointed Michele Nash as our Returning Officer. This is a role she has undertaken for the last eight triennial Board elections and is fully conversant with the new School Board Election legislation having conducted our 2021 bi-election to fill the vacancy of a retiring member.

School Board 2022 Elections

The Electoral Roll of eligible voters for the Parent Representative Elections is open for inspection and can be viewed, Monday to Friday, between 8.15am and 3pm at the School Office. You may request to sight your own entry. Addresses or contact details will not be visible.



Telephone enquiries are acceptable and welcomed [09 478 7734 Xtn 203]. In this case a name provided by the caller may be confirmed or not as being on the roll but **NO** addresses or contact details will be disclosed or discussed by the Returning Officer or staff authorised [during school office hours] to assist the Returning Officer with this aspect of verifying the Electoral Roll. For added privacy, the returning officer or authorised staff may choose to call you back to verify eligible voters on the roll.

To be eligible to be on the Electoral Roll and/or Supplementary Roll, you must have a child enrolled at St John's School on or before noon, 1st August 2022.

Nomination forms for Parent Representatives will be emailed to each person named on the Electoral Roll before 15th July. Additional nomination forms can be obtained from the School Office, from the School [website home page link](#) or by [emailing](#) the returning officer. Nominations close on 3rd August at noon.

As nominations are received a list will be available, at the School Office, for inspection at any reasonable time throughout the election process.

Statements by Nominees

If you are a candidate, you will be invited to submit, to the Returning Officer, an optional statement of up to 400 words about your experience, qualifications, abilities, previous involvement with the school, interests, and reasons for standing for election [signed by the nominee] and a photo. The Returning Officer is authorised to omit or abridge any part of the statement if it is likely to be defamatory or offensive or is too long. These profiles are published and circulated with voting papers. If a Nominee Statement is not given to the Returning Officer by noon of **3rd August 2022** that nominee's statement cannot be sent to voters with the voting papers. Please note that any person other than those ineligible under clauses 9 and 10 of [Schedule 23](#) of the Education and Training Act 2020 (details of which can be obtained at the School Office) may stand for election for the School Board; *however, if you are not on the Electoral Roll, you must be nominated by a person who is*. If you are on the school electoral roll and eligible to vote, you can nominate yourself and do not require a seconder, but you **MUST SIGN BOTH PARTS OF THE FORM**. The original of all documents must be submitted to the Returning Officer.

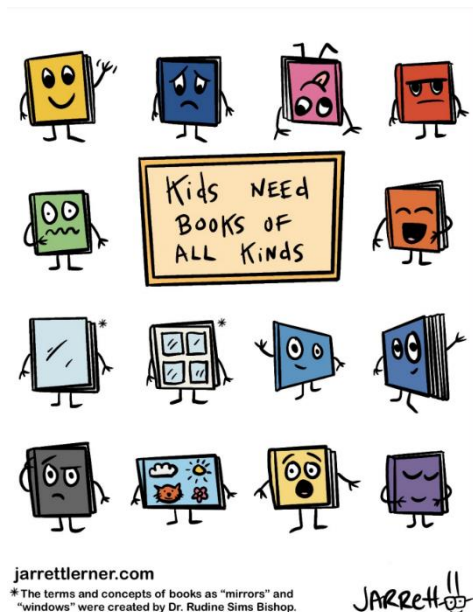
