WINNER: Margaret Mahy Book of the Year, Russell Clark Award for Illustration & Elsie Locke Award for Non-Fiction

A book described as taonga for this generation and the next, <u>Atua: Māori Gods and</u> <u>Heroes</u> by Gavin Bishop has been crowned the Margaret Mahy Book of the Year. Praised by the judges for its sense of magic and the way it validates mātauranga and te ao Māori truths, Atua is a must-have title for every Kiwi library.

Atua also won the Elsie Locke Award for Non-Fiction and the Russell Clark Award for Illustration.

WINNER: Picture Book Award

Masterfully blending words and images, <u>Lion Guards the Cake</u> by Ruth Paul takes home the Picture Book Award. This playful rhyming story about a cheeky stone lion who comes to life is a delight to read aloud and younger readers will adore the bright, bold and expressive illustrations.

The judges called Lion Guards the Cake "confident storytelling of the highest calibre". (*I personally highly disagree with this judging by the way as I think the Eight Gifts of Te Wheke was the winner!*)





WINNER: Wright Family Foundation Esther Glen Award for Junior Fiction

Described as an imaginative, thought-provoking novel with a "bit of creepy stirred in", **The Memory Thief** by Leonie Agnew wins the Wright Family Foundation Esther Glen Award for Junior Fiction. Following the adventures of a fierce girl and a lonely troll, this wholly original novel grabs the reader and holds them spellbound. The judges praised the author for their skill of writing and craft, as well as the depth and quality of language.

The following is an excerpt from Raising a Reader; How comics and Graphic Novels can help your kids love to read by Meryl Jaffe, PhD.

Comics! Graphic Novels and Learning:

Graphic novels are entering 21st century classrooms on all levels, for multiple goals and reasons. Here are a few of them:

Graphic novels empower 21st century learners.

Students are engaged in a verbal/visual communication explosion (infographics; icons on phones, computers and billboards; non-verbal image-driven directions; blogs, texting, and emails). Graphic novels clearly reflect this change. Graphic novels, like infographics, texting, and

emails, present essential ideas, dialogue and emotions through concise text and images. They also offer enticing multimedia reading experiences to all kinds of readers and learners.

Graphic novels attract all kinds of readers. From strong language learners to weak or second-language learners, graphic novels attract readers with incredible art and text that unfolds in a multimedia story experience.
