MISSION FAIR this Friday 21st October

We are thrilled to be able to hold our annual Mission Fair after a hiatus due to Covid restrictions.

In true Mary MacKillop fashion, *'Never see a need without doing something about it'*, the money raised will go to families at De Paul House in Northcote, who are less fortunate than us.



De Paul House provides housing and support services for those most vulnerable in our community, focusing on families with dependent children. Children will be able to wear <u>non uniform clothes</u> on the day at the cost of a <u>gold</u> <u>coin donation</u>.

We begin our Mission Day Fair after morning tea – this includes games, activities and raffles prepared <u>by the children for the children</u>. They pay to participate in the games and for this they will need 10¢ and 20¢ coins. Please prepare for this as change is <u>not</u> available from the school office. There will also be raffle prizes with tickets costing \$0.50 per ticket. Prizes include soft toys, stationery, arts, crafts, and sweet treats. **Tickets will be on sale all this week at lunchtime and on the day of the Mission Fair.**

The spirit of the day is one of giving to children who are not as well off as we are. We have encouraged the children to do little jobs at home, especially over the holidays, to earn money to bring, spend and donate. Children are invited at the end of the fair to contribute 'left-over' money to the fundraising effort. Please speak to your children about the spirit of the day as being one of giving to others.

There will also be a sausage sizzle at lunchtime kindly sponsored by the PTFA – sausages \$1.00 each.



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

All classes will be learning about the Rosary as October is the month of the Rosary. The Rosary is a very special prayer to Mary. It is a prayer that we can say together with our whānau and friends and think about the special life that Mary shared with her Son, Jesus, and what this means for our own lives.

Later this term, all classes will focus on the Holy Spirit strand. In their study of the Holy Spirit, the children will learn about the following:

- That the Holy Spirit Te Wairua Tapu is God, the third person of the Trinity with the very tapu holiness and mana - power of God - Atua.
- That the Holy Spirit enables them to grow in tapu and mana, through the gifts of grace, understanding and wisdom so they can follow their call to holiness and nurture their personal spirituality.
- That the Holy Spirit is present and affects whanau family, Church, Scripture, Sacrament, and the world.
- That there are titles and symbols of the Holy Spirit Te Wairua Tapu.
- That the mission of the Holy Spirit is creating, sustaining, and renewing the Church, bringing truth and liberation into people's lives, uniting them with Jesus and continuing his work such as in keeping with the Principles of Catholic Social Teaching.

UNIFORM REMINDER OF THE WEEK



You are reminded that the changeover to summer uniform takes place from the beginning of Term 4. Due to the fluctuating weather, there will be a period when either summer or winter uniform can be worn, however, all the children should be in summer uniform for the <u>third week of Term 4</u>, <u>beginning</u> <u>Monday, 31st October</u>. Please note that for this optional period, the children should wear either the existing summer uniform or the complete winter uniform which includes winter shoes.

HATS - These are a **compulsory item** and must be worn by the children during Terms 1 and 4. Hats must be the school uniform hat. For sun safety we recommend the updated design which can be purchased from <u>NZ Uniforms</u>.

Please ensure they are clearly named.

All St John's uniform pieces can be mixed and matched for all students, so long as the children are in full and correct St John's uniform. We want our children to always feel proud and comfortable in what they are wearing.



CARPARKING AT ST. JOHN'S SCHOOL

There are three alternative carpark areas for you to use.

SCHOOL CARPARK

Access via East Coast Road going **down** the hill from Rangitoto College

CHURCH CARPARK Access via Hastings Road

2. Please do not use the Church driveway off East Coast Road (this is a private driveway).

Please use this carpark for long term parking only if you are using the Church or staying on at school after you have dropped your children off.

For short term drop off and pick up of children, parents are asked to use the School Carpark or the school side of St. Ives, Penzance or 3. Hastings Roads.

Children are not allowed in the carparks unless accompanied by an adult.



CHURCH CARPARK	Children wait by the church and must be collected from there.
PENZANCE / HASTINGS / ST IVES	Children wait at Penzance Road front gate and must be collected from there.
SCHOOL CARPARK	Children will wait in the carpark shelter.

<u>Parents using the No Parking Pick Up / Drop Off Circular Zone :</u> Children will be able to move to your car via the footpath at the instruction of the Duty Teacher. If using this service you are **not permitted to leave your car**.

SOME FINAL MATTERS

- 1. Cars are prohibited from parking in the circular drop off and pick up area of the School Carpark and along the driveway to the carpark.
- 2. Please obey the signs and yellow 'No Parking' lines.
- 3. Drive slowly and safely in all carpark areas.
- 4. Use the DISABLED park only if you can display a disability parking pass.
- 5. Access to the school via the Penzance Road entrance is prohibited.
- 6. The School Carpark will be closed after 4pm and on the weekends.

SCHOOL CAR PARK AFTER SCHOOL PROCEDURES

THE CIRCLE

- There is space for 6 cars in the circle. Cars are to move forward to fill all 6 spaces.
- You may not park and exit your vehicle if in the circle area.
- As cars leave the circle, move forward to the front of the circle; It should always be full.
- 'After School Care' vans park in a parking space while waiting for the children.



PARKING

- It's best to arrive at school between 2.30 2.45pm if you wish to park.
- Fill car parks from the top (near circle) back. Do not leave gaps, as these will be difficult for others to access once the queue moves into the car park.
- If you arrive at school after 2.45pm and all spaces are full, please join the queue, or find alternative parking.



THE QUEUE

- If you arrive at school prior to 2.45pm, and the circle is full, and you are not parking, stop and queue just before the car parks begin.
- The car park is usually mostly full by 2.45pm. Once all parking spots are full waiting cars may move up to the circle
- No pushing in/cutting in front of first car in queue unless parking.
- Those in the queue, please keep in mind those queued right back to the entrance so move forward as soon as is appropriate.
- If the queue is right out to the entrance, please consider looking for alternative parking elsewhere to minimize the blocking of traffic coming down the hill.
- Do not use the right turn into the drive if driving north up East Coast Road if cars are already queued up to the entrance as this blocks the vision of those trying to exit.

DRIVING OUT

 Cars driving in (queuing) please be aware of parked cars wanting to leave and leave room for them to do so.
