Sunday, 27th November marks the beginning of Advent, a time for preparing for the coming of Christ. Each class has an Advent wreath and on Friday at 11.00am at St John's Church they will be blessed by Fr. Alejandro. It is a special part of our spiritual preparation for Christmas.

The Advent wreath is a circular evergreen wreath with four candles, three purple and one rose. The candles symbolise the light of Christ coming into the world. Each candle is first lit on the appropriate Sunday of Advent, and then the candles may be lit each

day as a part of the individual's or family's daily prayers.

Thanks to the great growing conditions our Garden to Table programme is producing lots of lovely vegetables, in fact, much more than we can use during the children's classes.


We will therefore be having a sale of the excess produce

You are offered a family key to take advantage of the pool for family swimming. The cost is \$80 for the entire season plus a \$20 key bond [refundable]. The season end is flexible, around 31st March 2023.



Keys are numbered and must be returned within four weeks of the end of the season when a bond refund will be given. If the key is not returned within this time the refund is forfeited as these keys need to be refigured and replaced each year. Keys can be purchased at the school office up until noon, Wednesday, 14th December when the office closes for the year.


COMMUNITY NOTICES
