At our PTFA AGM we decided on our **fundraising goals** for 2023. These goals have been divided into:

- short-term (immediate)
- mid-term (within the year)
- long term (~2 years).

Our **short-term** goals are subsidising school educational progammes across the various levels, a contribution to the Principal's Discretionary Fund, paying for the Year 6 parents that attend the school camp and subsidising the Year 6 end of year dinner.

Our mid-term goal is to fund a new Kapahaka Senior uniform.

Most excitingly our **long-term fundraising goal** will be a **Covered Outdoor Learning Area** (COLA) which will provide shelter from the elements and be of great benefit to all. The school is currently in the process of obtaining quotes for this and deciding on which area would be the most suitable. Once we have a confirmed target we will have an old-fashioned money thermometer created so that we can all see our fundraising progress. The COLA is going to require a substantial investment from the School and the PTFA is committed to assisting. We will therefore be committing a portion of all our smaller fundraising events this year to this long-term project as well as our School Gala later in the year.

Our next fundraising event for this Term will be **FROZEN Friday** on **31st March**. The children will be able to purchase a Juicie to enjoy with their lunch for **\$2.00**. We hope that this will be well supported.



We look forward to getting to know you all better and working together to achieve our fundraising goals.
