BEGINNING OF YEAR SCHOOL INTERVIEWS

Traditionally we have held 'Meet the Teacher' meetings between the class teachers and parents in about Week 3 of the school year. For 2024, instead of these meetings, we will be doing this a bit differently.

A new initiative for next year is that the first day of school, Thursday 1st February, will be our school interview day and not a full day of classes. It is an opportunity for you and your child to meet the class teacher and share your aspirations for your child for 2024 and any valuable information with them. It is also a chance to bring in stationery and have a look around the classroom. Students are expected to attend this interview with a parent(s) or caregiver(s). Students are required to attend their interview in school uniform.

Further information will be sent in December. Interview times will be booked through the School Interview website, as per normal, following the confirmation of class placement on the End of Year Report.

Friday 2nd February is our first full day of school classes.

2024 CLASS PLACEMENT

Teachers and Senior Leadership are now in the process of placing children into classes. Our teachers spend a lot of time getting to know your children as both people and learners. Therefore, their professional judgment is critical when placing the children in classes. UNIFORM AND SUN SAFETY

Due to the fluctuating weather at this time of the year, Weeks 1 and 2 are changeover periods from the Winter Uniform to the Summer Uniform. We ask that whichever uniform you chose for your child to wear, that they wear the complete and correct uniform, not mixing Summer and Winter.



The exception to this is the school hat. This is compulsory when playing outside in Term 4 irrespective of which uniform is worn. We encourage these to stay at school for the term so that they are always available. If a child does not have a hat, they will need to stay under one of the sheltered areas of the school. Hats can be purchased from <u>NZ Uniforms</u> via the website or from their shop located at 19A Douglas Alexander Parade, Rosedale, Albany.

You may wish to apply sunscreen <u>before</u> school and you are welcome to provide sunscreen in your child's bag for them to apply <u>themselves</u> at lunchtime.

All children will be in the Summer uniform following Labour Day, Tuesday 24th October.

MISSION FAIR Friday 20th October

Our Mission Fair is a highlight of the St. John's School Calendar. Community outreach combined with fun and fellowship!



In true Mary MacKillop fashion, 'Never see a need without doing something about it', the money raised this year will go to families at De Paul House in Northcote.

De Paul House provides housing and support services for those most vulnerable in our community, focusing on families with dependent children. Children will be able to wear non-uniform clothes on the day at the cost of a gold coin donation.

We begin our Mission Day Fair after morning tea – this includes games, activities and raffles prepared by the children for the children. They pay to participate in the games and for this they will need 10ϕ and 20ϕ coins. Please prepare for this as change is not available from the school office. There will also be raffle prizes with tickets costing \$0.50 per ticket. Prizes include soft toys, stationery, arts, crafts, and sweet treats. Raffle tickets will be on sale next week at lunchtime and on the day of the Mission Fair.

The spirit of the day is one of giving to children who are not as well off as we are. We encourage the children to do little jobs at home to earn money to bring, spend and donate. Children are invited at the end of the fair to contribute 'left-over' money to the fundraising effort. Please speak to your children about the spirit of the day as being one of giving to others.

There will also be a sausage sizzle at lunchtime kindly sponsored by the PTFA – sausages \$1.00 each.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

October is the month of the Rosary. The beauty of the Rosary is that it can be prayed on so many levels, in so many places, individually or communally. Because the prayers of the Rosary are memorized, we can pray it while doing other tasks. Some people pray the Rosary while driving or walking.

Pope Francis invites all Catholics to pray the Rosary for peace in Ukraine, all war-torn regions and for the Synod of Bishops on Synodality. At the time he said these words the conflict in the Israeli/Palestinian conflict had not started.

The conflict in Ukraine had a direct effect on our Year Six students. One of their classmates and their family left their very happy life in Mairangi Bay and returned to England to provide a secure haven for family members escaping the conflict.

We pledged to them that we would say the Rosary every week as Pope Francis had asked. The children continue to take great comfort in this gesture.

SCHOOL PHOTOS

Photolife are coming once again to take our school photos. Class, individual and sibling photos are scheduled for **Wednesday 25th October**, with sports photos being taken the following day, **Thursday 26th October**.

SIBLING PHOTOS: If you wish your children to have a sibling photograph where they are photographed together <u>we require the completed request form to be returned to the school office as soon as</u> **possible before 25th October**. No family is able to be photographed without this form. These will be coming home with your eldest child this week. Extra copies are available in the school office. Sibling photograph packs can be ordered and paid for, in due course, in the same way as the individual and class photos.

ORDERING PHOTOS: The ordering of Class, Individual & Sports Team photographs is online. This system works on a link to your child's name. After we have approved the proofs Photolife will email caregivers directly with a 'shoot key' code which you use to view and order your children's photographs online. The shoot key is unique to your child and gives a high level of security; students cannot access other student's photographs, and the system ensures images cannot be 'grabbed' off the internet and printed or posted to social media sites.
