Just a few reminders for this week:

- Please deliver your cakes and baking to the hall the morning of the Gala and remind your children to give their house points for each donation to the house captains before they leave the hall.


- The Turning Circle carpark will be closed from 9.00am on Friday to allow for Gala set up. If you normally use this for pick up, please make other arrangements for the afternoon.
- Those stallholders and helpers who are available for the day should arrive at the hall at 8.50am for a short briefing. Everyone is welcome and many hands make light work. Please remember to sign in using the electronic tablet in the office so we know who is on site. Lunch and morning tea is provided for helpers and pizza and a wine/beer will be provided for those who stay after the Gala to pack up. If you wanted to help on the day, it is not too late. - Friday is a normal school day for the children. They are expected to wear full school uniform.
- School finishes at 2.50pm and all children must be collected at the end of the day following normal pick-up procedures (reminder that the turning circle is closed on that afternoon). Be aware that the courts and playgrounds will be far busier than normal, so your help in getting the children away from school quickly will also keep them safe.
- The Gala starts at 4pm. It will be opened by our Year 6 Kapa Haka group. Following this, stalls will start trading. We ask that the Year 6 Kapa Haka group meet their teachers in Room 1 at 3:45pm prompt.
- EFTPOS will be available to withdraw cash throughout the Gala in R14, just opposite the hall.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION - ALL SAINTS AND ALL SOULS DAY

Last week we had two significant days on our liturgical calendar. We had All Saints Day on Wednesday and All Souls Day on Thursday. These days remind us that we are part of a faith and church that has always existed and is eternal, and that we need to pray for those who have gone before us.



The Feast of All Saints is the day on which we celebrate the lives of those who have given their lives to Christ, who have lived their lives for Our Lord, known and unknown. Those known, have been canonised by the Church. We pray for them all, known and unknown.

On the Feast of All Souls, Pope Francis asks people to pray for the world's forgotten dead, "those who no one remembers", the "victims of war and violence; the many little ones' of the world crushed by hunger and poverty" and "the anonymous who rest in common graves". We pray for all the souls of the dead, known and unknown.



Dear Lord, we pray for our own loved ones, family, our relatives, and friends who have died. Many of them are not famous, their statues are not in the church, but their pictures are in our homes and hearts. Their stories are alive in our families. We remember them with love. Amen.

NON UNIFOM DAY DIABETES



We will be hosting a Live Brave Mana Ora Do Blue Day next Tuesday, 14th November.

We invite the children to wear Blue non-uniform and bring a gold coin donation.

Blue Day raises awareness and supports young New Zealanders with type 1 diabetes.

There are nearly 278,000 people living with diabetes in New Zealand; more than 4,000 under 19yrs with type 1. Type 1 diabetes is an auto-immune health condition with no cure, requiring constant management and multiple daily injections or an insulin pump.

Donations collected from Do Blue Day will stay in our area and go directly towards supporting our young people living with type 1 diabetes and their families.

ATHLETICS DAY

SCHOOL ATHLETICS DAY - Wednesday, 15th November

Our School Athletics Sports take place on Wednesday, 15th November at the AUT Millennium Stadium. The children will walk to the Stadium via Rangitoto College with their teachers. Children need to bring a good lunch and plenty to drink for the day.

We will be starting our programme at 9:15am prior to the whole school's arrival, with the 800m event for Year 4 - 6 runners. All 800m runners are to be at the track by 9.00am as the event will be run before the rest of the school arrives. This is an optional event which some children will select to enter.

Parents: if your child is in this event, please taken them directly to the stadium where they are to report to Mrs Karen Dorrington.

From 9:45am onwards the Waitematā Team (Year 4-6) will be involved in a variety of activities on and around the track. The Rangitoto Team (Year 1-3) will be joining us at the stadium at 10:30am. For ease of organisation the children will be grouped in their year levels. Each child will have a card pinned to their T-shirt which will record their achievements throughout the day. The programme is detailed below.

PARENT HELP IS REQUIRED... If you are able to assist, please contact Mrs Dorrington via email at sports@sjmb.school.nz with your contact details. We require up to 24 helpers between 9.00am & 2.00pm. No experience necessary.

UNIFORM...The children will need their full School PE uniform including sports shoes, which they may wear to school, their school sunhat, a good lunch and drink and two medium to large safety pins to attach their House Cards to their shirt. Please ensure all items are named.

SUN SAFETY...

Slip... All children must wear their school PE uniform for the day.

Slop... Please ensure that your children have sunscreen on before they come to school.

Please also provide named sunscreen for your child to reapply at lunchtime.

Slap... All children must wear their school hat during the day.

and Drink... All children need to bring a named drink bottle which they will carry around with them

for the day. Water is highly recommended to keep the children hydrated during sport.

AN INVITATION TO ALL PARENTS... All parents, families and friends are welcome to come along and share the occasion. The AUT Millennium Stadium is in Antares Place. Feel free to sit on the grass bank, behind the track and fenced area, or on the grassy area behind the roped area. Please do not come down inside the track area. Access is via Apollo Drive, off Constellation Drive or Rosedale Road. Lunch will be from approx. 12:00pm – 12:30pm and your children will be able to join you on the grass bank then. Children are not permitted to leave the stadium during the lunch break.
