TOWARDS OCTOBER 2024

A new consultation document prepared by the bishops as part of the Holy Father's Synod 2021-24 process has been sent to Rome. This document, titled *Towards October 2024*, follows the NZ Catholic Bishops Conference being asked to establish a consultation process to discern responses to specific questions related to the Vatican's *Synodal Church in Mission* report. That report was published after the First Session of the 16th Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, held in Rome last October.

National Catholic lay organisations, agencies of the bishops' conference, religious, diocesan bodies, educational institutions, young people's groups, parish groups and groups involved in previous synodal processes took part in the consultation, between February and April this year. 
MATARIKI CELEBRATIONS

GARDEN TO TABLE: A COLLABORATIVE EFFORT WITH BUNNINGS SILVERDALE



On Tuesday, May 28th, Bunnings Silverdale visited St. John's with an assortment of goods for our Garden to Table area. The day began with our Kaitiaki Guardians meeting their team and welcoming them to our school.

The Men's Shed in Silverdale had built four new garden beds for us, with materials supplied by Bunnings. Alongside our students from Years 4 - 6, the beds were installed with great enthusiasm.




The first group of students had the unique opportunity to help drill two of the beds together. Bunnings also provided a raised vegetable bed, which the students built up lasagna-style by layering leaves, rotten branches, cardboard, clay, and mulch. This bed will later be covered with compost and soil and planted with additional plants provided by Bunnings.



Throughout the morning session, students were engaged in various tasks. Some dug holes, weeded, and cleared the ground for the new garden beds, while others filled the beds with soil and compost, and raked the soil. Students also used wheelbarrows to transport mulch to the larger garden bed in preparation for further planting. By the end of the morning, we even managed to plant some new vegetables in one of the beds.

The activity lasted over three hours, with classes taking 30-minute time slots to contribute to the new gardens. By the end of the session, Mrs. Moore and I saw many happy faces among the students, proud of their hard work and contributions to our school's Garden to Table project. Additionally, Bunnings provided us with 20 Harakeke plants to beautify some areas around St. John's.




Come work for us - Advocacy Lead at Caritas Aotearoa New Zealand
