Chair's Update (ADM):

We now have our thermometer fundraiser installed – thank you to Cube for the generous donation. A letter was sent to the parents explaining the COLA – what it is, where it will be located and what it will cost. In this letter was also information about what the PTFA had funded and agreed to fund for this year. The newsletter was available in Korean, Spanish and Chinese. I would like to thank KN, MU and Larry Yang for translating these documents. Our MiniOlympics has been launched, again with the information being available in Korean, Spanish and Chinese. We are very encouraging of these documents being translated into other languages, including Te Reo, but we would need a volunteer to do so. In the background work is being done on obtaining sponsorship for the Calendar raffle thanks to Sheryn. Thank you to everyone who is working so hard with the current fundraiser and with the other projects in the background. It is acknowledged and appreciated.

Principal's Update (MB):

Mr Ritson is now the new caretaker (who has a long history with the school). Catholic Character review – thank you to the parents who volunteered their time to come and share voice with the team – either in person or via the survery. Heard from a wide-range of families. Comments were very positive – common thread – the children felt safe, loved and protected and knew about God. Social outreach tied in with Matariki – our next big thing after the mini-Olympics. Helping ourselves and then helping others. Also farewelling Jill Marsh on Thursday 27th June.

Board Report (AMP): Board meeting with a strong focus on the Catholic Character review. We had a discussion about the funding for the COLA. MB has approached the Catholic schools office who said that the BNZ account (owned by the Bishop) can't be touched by us. Any invoices that come in must be paid by the Catholic schools office. Any money in the BNZ account must be used for capital building. Integrated schools cannot used Crown funds for building as they do not own the school. Currently we have enough in that account to meet the 50% of the COLA. Each term there is a \$44 donation that is added to the school accounts – currently \$11.25 of that goes into the BNZ account. We keep \$33.75 for the local school expenditure for school projects that can't be used for capital works. The Board has agreed that for the next 2 terms that the money will ALL go into the BNZ account so that it can contribute to the COLA. We won't get approval to build until all the money for the COLA is deposited into that account. We do have however approval in principle for the COLA. Spending of money on Mathletics was a School decision. If the PTFA felt that the parents did not want the PTFA to subsidise this, the school would require the parents to pay in full. PTFA is committed to subsidising Mathletics as long as the school felt that this was beneficial.

Treasurer's update (ZB):

Finally set up for ASB accounts

2 events held in May - Bingo night ~\$780 profit; Frozen Friday \$451.40 profit

Current balance (04/06/24):\$62,324 in the bank (Savings and chequing account)

Profit YTD: \$7260 (doesn't include Bingo night)

Will put into a Term Deposit: \$40K + takings from MiniOlympics (lock in for 1 year)

 consider" potentially in the future but not at this time.

Successful and enjoyable evening. Suggestion of a post-event gathering to be arranged/organised so that those who were wishing to continue on after the event with others in attendance could do so. Thought to be given to this for after the Quiz night in Term 3. No volunteers to assist with the set-up, but thankfully ADM was able to pull people in from around the school. Next event to unsure that there are sufficient volunteers for set up and that those that say that they are going to come do. Thanks to ADM for all her hard work on this.

3. **Movie night (21st June)** – Cost \$6 a ticket (\$4 for movie and \$2 for popcorn)
