SOCIAL OUTREACH - SNEAKER FRIDAY FOR DIABETES




Sneaker Friday is happening at St John's on Friday 22 November 2024!

YEAR FOUR GO TO CORBAN ESTATE ARTS CENTRE

On Tuesday we went to the Corban Estate Art Centre. First we went on the long, twirly bus and boy, was the ride long. When we finally got there, the people who worked there welcomed us. They taught us how to make cool light boxes. It took a lot of skill and good listening. There were a lot of steps to make these.

First we did sketching and my first and last idea was Saturn-V launching to the moon. I added fire and smoke so it looked real and cool.

Then we cut out the boxes and first we cut a triangle and then we used awls to cut the corners because we had to follow special lines to cut and it was hard with scissors. But by then it was morning tea and I ate all the yummy stuff my mum packed me. Then we had a little play. People were climbing trees and playing tag.

Next, came the hard bit! We had to glue, make, cut and sketch. It was really tough. I made smoke and stars and even fire! It looked really cool in the dark with the light on. My class and I went to the Corban Estate Arts Centre on Tuesday. We were welcomed by Whaea Molly and Whaea Jean. They showed us what our lightbox would look like. Their lightboxes amazed me because they looked so majestic.

My idea was my sister surfing but there is a monster trying to eat her. We sketched our idea first. Next, my class made the box and then drew a template. I made sure it was straight then I cut it out. Whaea Molly and Whaea Jean said that they made holes in our box and then said that we had to stick our lights on. If it was not stable we had to add tape, so I added a lot of tape.

Whaea Molly told us to make the ground or the terrain but the terrain had to be bigger than the light. Also, Whaea Molly told us to make two or more layers of ground. My terrain was very hard to make as I chose to do a spiral wave that looks like a baby fern. I was very proud of my terrain. I added my protagonist next, which was my sister on a surfboard. After I made my sister and a surfboard one of the grown ups told me that it would be cool to make it 3D and then the grown up showed me how to make 3D shapes. Once I had finished adding all my characters and my background I put it on one side of the box and looked at it on the other side.

Whaea Molly told us that if we put our lights on and look inside the dark, black box, we could see the glistening lights clearly. Afterwards, I went to the other room to put the box away and moments later we had a show. The room was filled with light and shadow. It was magnificent! – Rocio D.

Providing for Catholic Schools in the Auckland Diocese



Attendance Dues are used to pay for building related costs at Catholic Schools in the Auckland Diocese. Paving Attendance Dues is a condition of enrolment for all students attending New Zealand Catholic Schools. Attendance Dues are compulsory – there is a legal requirement for parents and caregivers to pay Attendance Dues under the Education and Training Act 2020.
