The last few weeks have been a busy few weeks, and there are still many exciting things coming up in the next three weeks before we head into the Winter school holidays.



You may have seen recent media coverage about the Ministry of Education's refreshed approach to teaching Reading and Writing, alongside the rollout of the new English Curriculum. As part of this, our teachers are undertaking professional development in structured literacy – a research-based approach designed to support all learners, particularly in the foundational years of literacy.

CONFIRMATION AND HOLY COMMUNION

Along with Baptism, the Sacraments of Holy Communion and Confirmation complete the three Sacraments of Initiation, a figurative doorway into the fullness of Church life. Confirmation is the Sacrament that graces you with the Holy Spirit, sealing the covenant made at Baptism. The rite of Confirmation is anointing the forehead with chrism oil, together with the laying on of the minister's hands and the words, "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit."

WRITTEN REPORTS

Statement from the Ministry of Education to Support Schools with Reporting to Parents



As part of our focus on lifting student achievement we have introduced new, knowledge–rich and internationally–comparable curriculum this year for Maths in Years 0–8 and English in Years 0–6, and Te Reo Rangatira Years 0-6 and Pāngarau Years 0-8 wāhanga ako.

This means we are currently changing from the old to the new curriculum. We want to acknowledge that schools and kura will only have been using the new curricula from the start of 2025, which includes new teaching and assessment methods and content.

Because of this you could see a change in your child's progress or achievement compared to previous years which may be the result of changes in the curriculum expectations for your child's year level. If you have concerns or questions about your child's achievement, we strongly suggest you talk with your child's teacher or kaiako. They will also have used their own observations, classroom tasks and other tests to report on the progress your child is making.

The Mid-Year Reports will read a little differently this year. You will be receiving your child's progress report at the end of the week. It will share with you what your child has achieved and their next steps, in relation to the new curriculums. Instead of reporting against a Curriculum Level (which generally covered two years at school), the reports will indicate how your child is progressing against the learning expectations for their year level.

Included in the report envelope will be an explanation of the descriptors being used at this time, whilst the Ministry of Education descriptors are being finalised.

The Ministry of Education has also shared a link to a <u>Parent Portal</u>. This website contains general information as to the programme of learning for each year level and activities that you can do at home to support your child's learning.

PROJECT JONAH VISIT


On Tuesday, 20th May, Michael from Project Jonah came to St John's School with a giant inflatable Humpback whale, which had a length of 13m and a width of 8m. It was called Jonah. First, we were instructed to sit behind a red and blue rope that was tied to two chairs. Then, Michael told us about what Project Jonah is, facts about Humpback whales, Humpback whales' behavior, and lastly, what impact human activity has on humpback whales.

Next, we were arranged into 2 different groups to go inside the whale. 15 at a time. We didn't know what to expect, but when we entered the Humpback whale, Michael told us we were going to see the organs of the whale. Michael went from the front to the back, going through all the organs in the whale's body.

When we sat down inside the whale, the sides of the whale blew up, and became like a wall coming out of the ground. Inside the humpback whale, there are 161 bones! The tail is made out of ears, and the teeth are made out of fingernails.

When we were not inside the whale, we did a whale activity booklet where we had to copy the organs of the Humpback whale into the body with a pencil. This activity was easy as we had just learnt about the different organs of the whale's body. On the next page of the booklet, there was a word search. The word search was where you had to find specific words.





Thank you for your support of our Adventure Run...here is a bit more information about Friday.

What do the children need to wear?

- Children need to come to school in old clothes that can get MUDDY, SLIMY and WET.
- Please leave all school uniforms at home on Friday.
- Children need to wear trainers on the course. Please provide shoes that can get dirty and wet.

What do the children need to bring in their bags?

- Children will be getting wet and muddy, so will need to bring a change of clothes (including underwear) in their bags to get changed into after the run. We recommend that they have warm clothes.
- Children will also need to bring an **old towel** to dry themselves after the run. This towel may get a bit muddy too.
- Please pack **a plastic bag** for the children to put their clothes and towel in after they get changed.
- Please ensure everything that comes to school is named.

Does my child need lunch and morning tea?

- There will be a break for morning tea in the classrooms before the run.
- Sausages and juicies are available for purchase before the day through Kindo.
- Subway is still available as normal, and the children can eat these after their runs.
- The children may be a bit hungrier than normal, so you may wish to pack a little extra.
- Please ensure they have a named water bottle at school.

What time will they be running?

- The Rangitoto Team (Year 0-3, Rooms 7-13) is starting their run at 11:00am and finishing at 12:00pm.
- The Waitematā Team (Year 4-6, Rooms 1-6) is starting their run at 12:00pm and finishing at 1:00pm.
- While we reserve the right to change the times if needed, we are planning to stick as close to these times as possible.

What if my child is a bit nervous?

- Children will be encouraged to embrace the adventure.
- If they don't want to attempt one of the obstacles, there will always be the option to bypass, and move on to the next one. It is all about them challenging themselves and having FUN!

What happens if it is raining?

- If it rains lightly, we will continue as planned. If the weather will impact health and safety, we will email to let you know that we will postpone by 10:00am.
- In the event of a postponement, the children will still receive their sausages and juicies.

Can I come and watch?

- We would love you to come and watch.
- Because of the number of people on the course, we ask that you stay in the designated spectator areas (there will be maps available on the day).
- We are hoping that there will be a few minutes at the end of each run if you want to have a turn on the course WITH YOUR CHILD.
- While we welcome preschoolers to watch from the spectator area with their parents, the course is not suitable for under 5's.
- Please leave all dogs at home on this occasion.
- If you wish to talk to your child after the race, for privacy reasons, please wait outside of the classroom while the children are getting changed. The class teachers will let you know when you can enter the classroom.

Do we need helpers?

• If you are able to help on the day, please contact ptfa@sjmb.school.nz. Please include what times you are able to help.

When are the prizes announced?

- We will be coming together in the hall at 2:00pm to announce the top individual and class fundraisers and give out the last spot prizes.
- You are most welcome to join us for this assembly.

Where can we park?

- The school car park will be open as normal, accessed off East Coast Rd.
- There is a Mass on Friday morning, so please be considerate of the parishioners attending Mass.
 Mass will be finished at 10:30am.
- Street parking is available in the surrounding streets. Please be considerate of access to driveways.

What about toilet facilities for adults?

- Toilet facilities for adults are in the hall. The school toilet block is for children only.
- A wheelchair accessible toilet is available in the school office.
- Pool changing rooms will be available for adults who may wish to get changed.

What if I need to collect my child early?

 Please sign your child out at the office as normal, and then take the slip to the class teacher when collecting your child.
