WINTER ILLNESSES AND ABSENCES



We know that every day of attendance at school makes a positive difference to your child's learning, however, no child can focus on learning if they are feeling sick or miserable. At this time of the year, it is not uncommon that children get sick with coughs and colds and other Winter illnesses.

As part of our commitment to the wellbeing of all students and staff, we kindly ask that you keep your child at home if they are unwell – especially if they require medication such as paracetamol (e.g. <u>Pamol</u>) to get through the day. While paracetamol can ease discomfort, it often masks symptoms without treating the underlying illness.

Unwell children may find it hard to concentrate and fully engage in learning, and they may also spread illness to others. Keeping them at home until they have fully recovered helps protect everyone in our school community.

We appreciate that every child is different, and you know your child best, however, please ensure they return to school when they are fully well and ready to participate in learning. Thank you for your support in keeping our school a healthy place for all.

RETURNING TO SCHOOL AFTER VOMITING OR DIARRHOEA

To help prevent the spread of illness, we follow Ministry of Health guidelines, which recommend that children stay home for at least 48 hours after the last episode of vomiting or diarrhoea. This allows time for full recovery and helps keep other students and staff safe from infection.

ABSENCE NOTIFICATION

Please inform the school office of your child's absence as soon as possible, identifying the reason for the absence as due to illness. Either via Tel: 09 478 7734 #1, email: office@simb.school.nz, or the school website. For safety reasons, we do not assume that a student is "still sick" if thay are away a second day. Please inform the office each and every day your child is absent.
