DANCE CURRICULUM

STRUCTURED LITERACY DATA

Our teachers are participating in the Ministry of Education's Structured Literacy Approaches Professional Development to continue to strengthen their skills in teaching language and reading. As part of this, they will be using a quick, one-minute assessments with the tamariki to measure their progress. This information will help the teacher to plan the next steps in their learning. The **anonymised** results will be shared with the Ministry of Education to help them understand the impact of this training, and no personal information will ever be used in any reports or publications. If you are happy for your child's results to be used this way, you don't need to do anything. If you would prefer not to have their data shared, please let their teacher know. 
EASY LUNCHES WITH EZLUNCH
