SCHOOL PHOTOS



Photolife were at school today taking our Sport team photos. Class, individual and sibling photos will be taken tomorrow, **Wednesday 22**nd **October**.

All children will be photographed for a class photo and an individual photo. We ask that children are in tidy and correct <u>full Summer uniform</u> for class and individual photos.

SIBLING PHOTOS: If you wish for your children to have a sibling photograph where they are photographed together Photolife require a completed request form, copies were sent home with the children earlier this term. No family will be photographed without this form. Extra or replacement copies are available in the school office. Sibling photograph packs can be ordered and paid for, in due course, in the same way as the individual and class photos.

ORDERING PHOTOS: The ordering of Class, Individual and Sports Team photographs is online. This system works on a specific link to your child's name. After we have approved the proofs Photolife will email caregivers directly with a 'shoot key' code which you use to view and order your children's photographs online. They will also detail the order deadline date for free delivery to school. The shoot key is unique to your child and gives a high level of security; students cannot access other student's photographs, and the system ensures images cannot be 'grabbed' off the internet and printed or posted to social media sites.

As teachers and Senior Leadership begin planning for next year's class placements, we invite parents to share any information they believe is important for us to consider regarding their child's needs. If you wish to share information about any learning or social/emotional needs that may impact your child's learning, please feel free to complete the form by the end of Tuesday 28th October.



Please note that while we make every effort to consider all requests, we cannot guarantee that all requests will be met due to the complex balancing of factors that goes into creating our class lists. In addition to considerations for individual students, the criteria we consider when making class placements are:

- A balance of boys and girls
- A balance of academic diversity in learning styles and capabilities
- A balance of ethnic diversity and cultural backgrounds
- Socially balanced groups to minimise peer conflicts and promote positive interactions, and,
- a balance between current classes, so new friendships can be formed.

While we value your input, please understand that as professionals, we will make final decisions based on a holistic view of each child's academic, social, and emotional well-being. Our goal is to create the best possible learning environment for all students, and we appreciate your trust in this process.

<u>Confirmed</u> placements for 2026 will be included in your child's end of year school report which will be given to your child(ren) on the last day of Term 4.

We have noticed a number of children do not have a hat at school. All children are required to wear the school hat when playing outside in Term 4. If they do not have their hat, they will need to play in the shade. Hats can be purchased from NZ Uniform.

Please ensure that ALL items that your child/ren bring to school are clearly named.

We also ask that they bring their full P.E. uniform to school on Monday morning and that it is left at school then returned home on Friday if it needs washing.

ATHLETICS DAYS

YEAR 4 – 6 ATHLETICS DAY – Wednesday, 29th October



Our Year 4 - 6 Athletics Sports take place on Wednesday, 29^{th} October at the **AUT Millennium Stadium**.

This day has a dual purpose of showcasing the skill development from the PE athletics focus this term as well as being part of the selection process for the Interschool Athletics event.

PARENT HELP IS REQUIRED... Throughout the day students will rotate around different athletics activities; sprints, long jump, high jump, shotput and discus throwing. We will be starting our programme at 8:30am with the 800m event. This is an optional event which some children will select to enter. All 800m runners are to be at the track by 8:20am as the event will be run before the other children arrive.

PARENTS: if your child is in the 800m event, please take them directly to the stadium where they are to report to Mrs Karen Dorrington.

The rest of the children will walk to the Stadium via Rangitoto College with their teachers. Children need to bring a good lunch and plenty to drink for the day.

From 9:20am onwards the children will be involved in a variety of activities on and around the track. For ease of organisation the children will be grouped in their year levels. The programme is detailed below.

SUN SAFETY...

Slip... All children must wear their school PE uniform for the day.

Slop... Please ensure that your children have sunscreen on before they come to school.

Please also provide named sunscreen for your child to reapply at lunchtime.

Slap... All children must wear their school hat during the day.

and Drink... All children need to bring a named drink bottle which they will carry around with them

for the day. Water is highly recommended to keep the children hydrated during sport.

UNIFORM...The children will need their full School PE uniform including sports shoes, which they may wear to school, and their school sunhat. Please ensure all items are named. We have changed the way we record results this year. Children no longer need to bring safety pins as we are moving to recording sheets and will no longer have cards.

AN INVITATION TO ALL PARENTS... All parents, families and friends are welcome to come along and share the occasion. The AUT Millennium Stadium is in Antares Place. Feel free to sit on the grass bank, behind the track and fenced area, or on the grassy area behind the roped area. Please do not come down inside the track area. Access is via Apollo Drive, off Constellation Drive or Rosedale Road. Lunch will be from approx. 12:00pm – 12:30pm and your children will be able to join you on the grass bank then. Children are not permitted to leave the stadium during the lunch break.

END OF SPORTS DAY PROCEDURES... At the end of the sports day (approx. 2:25pm) the children will assemble on the field. Parents wishing to take their children home may do so but will need to collect them from the field as the classes are called out. It is important for the teachers to know which children have been taken by parents and which have not. Please help us in this and follow this procedure.

You are reminded that if you wish your children to be collected by someone else, a note MUST be given to the class teacher in the morning. All other children will return to school and leave from there as normal.

YEARS 1 – 3 RUN, JUMP, THROW

Our Rangitoto team will be showcasing their athletics skills with a Run, Jump, Thow Day at school on Wednesday 19th November. From 12:30 - 2:30pm the students will rotate around their athletics activities as a culmination of the PE athletics focus this term. To support us in the logistical organisation of the day, we ask you to remain in these areas, and not come into the areas where the children are participating.






