- teach students a range of safe practices that they can use when interacting with other people, both online and face to face.
- teach students how to recognise the difference between healthy and unhealthy relationships, and encourage students who have been or are being abused to seek help.
- prevent abuse by making parents and teachers more aware of their responsibilities to help students avoid abuse.

We invite parents to a meeting with our school Community Officer to find out more about Keeping Ourselves Safe.


The meeting will be held in the School Hall on Tuesday, October 14th at 9:00am.

MISSION FAIR

On Friday, Week 2, the children will gather and participate in social outreach through our annual Mission Fair. Following the success of last year's new format where funds were contributed through Kindo, we will be using this format again this year. Please refer to the email from Mrs Mountjoy that you received at the end of last term (September 16th) for more details.

This is a NON-UNIFORM DAY; however, children are still required to wear a hat for sun safety. This does not need to be the uniform hat.



The beneficiary this year is Caritas NZ for their support of the crisis in the Holy Land. When disasters and conflict cause suffering across the globe, Caritas is there to help.

Currently in Gaza entire neighbourhoods lie in rubble. Water, food, electricity and medical care are severely restricted. Entire communities are cut off from essential supplies due to a blockade. Children are dying from hunger. Caritas NZ is partnering with Caritas Jerusalem, allowing their support to be got to those who need it the most.

DOGS ON SCHOOL GROUNDS

The school is generally a no dog site, however, for school families we make exceptions during pick up and drop off. For this to continue, we need to ensure that our school is safe for everyone, including our furry friends.

Please remember that for the safety of our students and staff, any dog brought onto school grounds must always be on a short lead and under the control and direct supervision of an adult, i.e. the adult is holding the lead at all times. We also ask that they stay outside the classrooms. If you wish to go into the classroom, we ask that your dog stays at home or in the car. Thank you for your co-operation.



NEAREST AND DEAREST

Last term, we shared our intention to reschedule our 'Nearest and Dearest' Day to sometime this term. Whilst we have selected a tentative date in Week 6, we are cognisant that the school calendar this term is already incredibly full. With a number of upcoming school events, including a Teacher Only Day, and the possibility of a strike day (which we are awaiting further information on), we are very conscious that we are asking a lot from family members who wish to share in these events in terms of taking time off work to attend or to look after their children while the school is closed.

We want to respect your time and not place an excessive burden on families. Therefore, we are seeking your input on how to proceed:

SCHOOL PHOTOS



Photolife are coming once again to take our school photos. Sports photos are scheduled for **Tuesday 21**st **October**, with class, individual and sibling photos the following day on **Wednesday 22**nd **October**.

All children will be photographed for a class photo and an individual photo. We ask that children are in tidy and correct full Summer uniform for class and individual photos.

SPORTS PHOTOS: All teams will be photographed in their PE gear, with the exception of Netball and Basketball, which will be photographed in the uniform they play in.

Coaches and Managers are very welcome to join their teams for their photographs; however, we are unable to provide a specific running order or indication of what time of day specific teams will have their photograph taken. If you would like to attend and have some flexibility, please email Karen Dorrington at sports@sjmb.school.nz who may be able to give more guidance on timing closer to the date.

SIBLING PHOTOS: If you wish for your children to have a sibling photograph where they are photographed together **Photolife require a completed request form**, these should be returned to the school office as soon as possible and before 22nd October. No family will be photographed without this form. These will be coming home with your eldest child this week. Extra or replacement copies are available in the school office. Sibling photograph packs can be ordered and paid for, in due course, in the same way as the individual and class photos.

ORDERING PHOTOS: The ordering of Class, Individual and Sports Team photographs is online. This system works on a specific link to your child's name. After we have approved the proofs Photolife will email caregivers directly with a 'shoot key' code which you use to view and order your children's photographs online. The shoot key is unique to your child and gives a high level of security; students cannot access other student's photographs, and the system ensures images cannot be 'grabbed' off the internet and printed or posted to social media sites.

CHANGEOVER TO THE SUMMER UNIFORM

Shoes:	Leather sandals plain, flat black Roman sandal style
Hat:	Navy monogrammed bucket hat – Term 1 & 4

SUN SMART

As we move into the warmer months, it is important for all students to wear hats during outdoor activities to protect against the strong UV rays in New Zealand. Sun safety is a priority, and wearing hats helps ensure we stay safe and healthy while enjoying time outdoors.

All children are required to wear the school hat when playing outside in Term 4. This starts at the beginning of the term, irrespective of what uniform the children are wearing. If they do not have their hat, they will need to play in the shade. Hats can be purchased from NZ Uniform.

Please ensure that ALL items that your child/ren bring to school are clearly named.

We also ask that they bring their full P.E. uniform to school on Monday morning and that it is left at school then returned home on Friday if it needs washing.
